BEN believes in a school system that pays attention to the physical and emotional as well as the intellectual needs of kids, building networks, expanding horizons and drawing parents close.

What sets our program apart is its holistic approach to education. Through hands-on exploration and immersive experiences, we're not merely imparting knowledge; we're igniting a lifelong love for learning. Research underscores the pivotal role of background knowledge and mastery of the alphabetic code in reading proficiency. The Horizons program augments this foundation by enriching children's "bank" of usable vocabulary through exposure to a diverse array of experiences.

Life in a school is made up of a developmental triangle:

- The core instructional program
- The academic social, cultural and recreational offerings which are designed to expand student's opportunities for learning; and
- The support services, which can remove barriers to learning.

Theory of Change

- 1. BEN believes that the best way to transform our school system is to support public school teachers
- 2. If we provide support at the classroom and individual child level in the areas of language, literacy and numeracy as well as social emotional learning, and if we partner with parents, teachers and community members, we can increase the likelihood of positive life outcomes for at risk children.

MISSION

"To build a professional learning community that increases the opportunities and services available to public school students and teachers."





COMMUNITY NEED

BEN exists to address educational gaps which have been exacerbated by the Covid-19 pandemic. The need for summer remediation is highlighted by the willingness of twenty five teachers to give their time during July for BEN's reading program. There is also a recognition that in order to prevent young learners from developing reading challenges, we need to enhance professional development opportunities for those responsible for teaching reading and disseminate insights on the Science of Reading.

BRIEF HISTORY OF ORGANIZATION

Since 2010 Bermuda Education Network has provided opportunities for students and teachers in all of the schools in the public school system. Our first program, the Math Springboard program, provided adolescents with a combination of math coaching and work-shadow experience at international businesses. Many of the students who we introduced to insurance and reinsurance are underwriters, actuaries and brokers in Bermuda today. In 2016, in response to the need for earlier educational intervention and increased support for teachers, we suspended our Springboard program to focus exclusively on gaps in the primary school curriculum and creating a network of teachers to help us.


Over the past ten years we have developed a large network of hundreds of teachers as well as business supporters and community groups and we have created opportunities that public school educators can apply for directly. We are a trusted alternative for school improvement.

In 2017, BEN launched an annual Outstanding Teacher Award which invites Bermuda public school teachers to nominate their fellow educators and culminates in an award ceremony which in 2022 took place at Government House and was hosted by Her Excellency, the Governor.

The winners and finalists of BEN's awards are invited to contribute via our Awards Committee, through "passion projects" and as tutors for our Summer Program.



HORIZONS

All BPS teachers from P2-P5 can sign up for free experiential learning expeditions with tie-in professional development workshops, and cross-curricular lesson plan support. We collaborate with Bermuda Sloop Foundation, Kaleidoscope Arts Foundation, BUEI, BZS, The AgraLiving Institute, the St. Georges Historical Society and the St. David's Historical Society.

NEW this year! P2 and P3 themed units with KAF, BZS and BUEI and a Discovery Day offered to Purvis Primary in collaboration with Agra Living and Masterworks Museum.

The number of expeditions completed was 173.



BEN BOOK CLUB

Creates an opportunity for children to develop language skills at the pre-reading stage, such as phonemic awareness, rhyme and repetition.

NEW! Music, movement, and craft activities added to the monthly story time events

46 families received free activities and books worth \$150+



SUMMER LEARNING

Intensive three week summer reading intervention provided by specialist teachers and tutors with enrichment from Kaleidoscope Arts Foundation.

44 students completed the program.



OUTSTANDING TEACHER AWARDS

BEN's annual Outstanding Teacher Awards recognizes the accomplishments of exceptional teachers in public schools and provides grants and support for teacher leadership opportunities. The 2023 winner was Hewitt Taylor, Mathematics teacher at The Berkeley Institute.

10 local teachers received \$1000 and attended a ceremony hosted at HSBC.



YOUNG CODERS & ENGINEERS CLUB

Outstanding Teacher of the Year 2021 Finalist, Mr. Troy King continued to lead the Young Coders and Engineers Club. S1 & S2 students attended weekly robotics and coding lessons with our partner, Connectech.

14 Senior School students received weekly STEM lessons throughout 2023.

THE NETWORK

In 2023 BEN welcomed Fiona Murdoch as Program Director and Robyn Hooper who joined our team of Network teachers who have full time jobs as teachers and serve as "ambassadors" for BEN's programs. This includes helping to design lesson plans and field trips and leading workshops.
